DRIVEWAY PLOWING AND MAINTENANCE

The Village plows private drives at the direction of the Police Chief when a snowfall reaches a 3" accumulation.

THIS IS DONE TO MAINTAIN EMERGENCY ACCESS ONLY.

A more complete driveway clearing is the responsibility of the property owner. All driveways should be clearly marked indicating where the boundaries of the driveway are. Please note that driveways that are not clearly delineated with reflective markers may not be plowed.

Please keep the areas around your driveway trimmed back to 12' wide X 12' high (if possible) to be free of obstruction. This will ensure that emergency services can get to your door. The Village police and local fire services would appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

ELECTION INFORMATION

The Spring Primary, if necessary, will be held on February 21, 2017 at the Village Hall. Polling hours are 7:00am to 8:00pm. Ballot information will be published by Waukesha County in the "Focus on Oconomowoc" prior to the election and sample ballots will be available in the Village Hall.

SPRING ELECTION

The Spring Election will be held on April 4, 2017. The following Village offices will be up for election.

PRESIDENT—2 YEAR TERM 3 TRUSTEES—4 YEAR TERMS

If you are interested in seeking one of these offices, nomination papers may be obtained at the Village Hall. Completed nomination papers must be turned in to the Village Clerk no later than 5:00pm on January 3, 2017. Please contact the Village Clerk if you have any questions about the Spring Election or the offices open for election. The Spring Election may also include candidates for Supreme Court Justice, Court of Appeals Judge, Circuit Court Judge, County Non-partisan Offices, School District Offices, and Referenda (if required).

2016 TAX COLLECTION

A II 2016 tax payments will be collected by the Waukesha County Treasurer's Office. Payments will not be accepted at the Village Hall.

To Pay By Mail: Send payment to Waukesha County Treasurer, 515 W. Moreland Blvd., Room 148, Waukesha, WI 53188-2428. Checks should be made payable to the Waukesha County Treasurer. A receipt will be mailed to you.

To Pay In Person: Payment can be made in person at the Waukesha county Treasurer's office, 515 W. Moreland Blvd., Room 148, Monday through Friday from 8:00am to 4:30pm. Please be aware that you must go through a security screening process at the main door of the courthouse.

Escrow Checks: If your escrow check is more than the amount of your taxes, a refund check from the Village for the overpayment will be sent.

County Website: You may access your tax bill online by going to <u>www.waukeshacounty.gov</u>, and by clicking on the tax listings box. You may search by tax key or address.

DOG LICENSES

The Village requires that all dogs be licensed as per Wis. State Statute 95.21(2)(a). The dead-line for registration of your dog is March 31, 2017.

A dog license application is enclosed in your property tax bill. You may mail your application and check to the Village Hall or apply in person Monday through Friday between 8:00am and 2:00pm. Please do not send your dog license application with your tax bill to the County.

A copy of proof of current rabies vaccination MUST be attached to your application. This is required before we can issue any dog licenses.

The license fee is \$15.00 for each spayed or neutered dog, or \$17.00 for each dog that is not spayed or neutered. There will be a \$5.00 late fee assessed after Mary 31, 2016. If a dog is found unlicensed in the Village, the owner will be issued a citation. Any questions regarding dog licenses may be directed to Michele or Jennifer at the Village Hall.

VACATION NOTIFICATIONS

WINTER ICE SAFETY TIPS WHEN IS ICE SAFE?

There really is no sure answer. You can't judge the strength of ice just by its appearance, age thickness, temperature, or whether or not the ice is covered with snow. Strength is based on all these factors—plus the depth of water under the ice, size of the water body, water chemistry and currents, the distribution of the load on the ice, and local climatic conditions.

Recommended Minimum Thickness for New Clear Ice

4" Ice fishing and small group activities 5" Snowmobiles and ATV's

NOTE: Motor vehicles are <u>not</u> allowed on Oconomowoc Lake

Remember, common sense is your greatest ally in preventing ice accidents. Five minutes of checking ice from shore, and systematic checks while on the ice can mean the difference between an enjoyable outdoor experience and a tragedy.



BE A SURVIVOR!

L et's say you have taken all the precautions and you're going to try your luck at ice fishing. As you walk out on the ice, you hear a crack and fall through. Suddenly you find yourself immersed in water so cold it literally takes your breath away. And the pain is incredible! What should you do? First, try not to panic. This may be easier said than done, unless you have worked out a survival plan in advance.

- 1. **Don't remove your winter clothing.** Heavy clothes won't drag you down, but instead can trap air to provide warmth and flotation. This is especially true with a snowmobile suit.
- 2. **Turn toward the direction you came.** That's probably the strongest ice.
- 3. Place your hands and arms on the unbroken surface. This is where a pair of nails, sharpened screwdrivers or ice picks come in handy in providing the extra traction you need to pull yourself up onto the ice.
- 4. Kick your feet and dig in your ice picks to work your way back onto the solid ice. If your clothes have trapped a lot of water, you may have to lift yourself partially out of the water on your elbows to let the water drain before starting forward.
- 5. Lie flat on the ice once you are out and roll away from the hole to keep your weight spread out. This may help prevent you from breaking through again.
- 6. Get to a warm, dry, sheltered area and rewarm yourself immediately. In moderate to severe cases of cold water hypothermia, you must seek medical attention. Cold blood trapped in your extremities can come rushing back to your heart after you begin to re-warm. The shock of the chilled blood may cause ventricular fibrillation leading to a heart attack and death!
