Kim Loehrer made several comments with regard to the LaLumiere dredging:

- 1. Looking at the plan, there appears to be no dredging near their boats.
- 2. At the last meeting when billing for this was discussed, it was said that it will be based on land assessment, but what does that constitute?
- 3. She thought that if one owner refused then the whole plan would be cancelled.

Mr. Bickler presented an Honorary Plaque for Joe Birbaum to Mimi Birbaum. Mr. Bickler also presented an Honorary Plaque to Ed Johnson.

ADMINISTRATOR

Discussion/action regarding LaLumiere dredging

Mr. Janicsek introduced Ms. Dalman and Mr. Bulls from Eco Waterways. They explained the exact process of the dredging. The project would take 2-3 months and would ideally be in the fall (October, November, December). They also explained that the next steps would be to schedule a public hearing or public notice.

The question that Ms. Loehrer asked was addressed: The scope of the project could change to meet the needs for dredging near boats and docks and also the turnaround area. Ms. Dalman explained that the cost would be adjusted if there were any changes to the proposed project. Mr. Wiemer suggested looking into opening up the other channel to the lake.

Mr. Fischer addressed some of the financial aspects of the project, but emphasized that we need the environmental approval from a public hearing or notice, and then address the finances. Next month there will be a closed session guidance for the Finance Committee for financing this project.

It was suggested that Village residents be notified of this project.

Motion (Waltersdorf/Zimmermann) to authorize the Village to email and mail Village residents about this project and proceed to request a public hearing by the DNR. <u>Carried unanimously.</u>

Update on private snow plowing

Mr. Janicsek presented a spreadsheet with costs of snowplowing with various scenarios. Mr. Fischer said he does not want to change the current policy. President Bickler suggested that we have all residents sign a new, more clear snowplow form in order to alleviate perceptions of the scope of plowing. Mr. Macy said that Staff should discuss other aspects of plowing such as requiring stakes on all driveways.

No Action Taken

Update on Sawyer Road lot

Mr. Janicsek explained that the cost of the culvert would be \$1200. Lake County Engineering will proceed with marking the lot lines which will cost \$900. The Rammes donated \$200 toward that cost.

Discussion/action regarding income continuation insurance

Mr. Janicsek explained that everyone in WRS was eligible for income continuation insurance and there were no premiums due at this time.

Motion (Zimmermann/Taylor) to offer income continuation to all employees. Carried unanimously.
